Tractor Building

King Construction got started a little late due to delays at another job site, but once they got on site things started happening quick! They have completed their work with only a couple of punch list items to be addressed. **It's awesome!** We have funding to install the concrete inside the building as well as the front shed overhang. Our construction guys have a lot of site work remaining, and the construction crew will install the 4 foot mezzanine to display light weight wooden farm implements and such. It's exciting to see the progress.



Saw Mill

We need to have a few days on the mill in the early spring to cut all the material needed for the mezzanine in the museum building. That project is not part of the King Construction project, so we'll be handling it. We also need to continue cutting for another engine building, even though it will probably not be built until 2020. Yes, ANOTHER!

Still wanted – Logs for the saw mill. Even though we received a substantial number of logs, we are still on the lookout for more. 16'6" pine logs in particular that are 20 inch diameter or more on the small end will make good rafters. 12'6" logs of similar size will be used for 2X4's and siding. We have a good supply, but having extra material in stock would be nice. Power has been installed to the woodworking building and the piping extended to the saw mill and tractor shed. We still need to install the wiring to the mill, and down to the tractor shed.

Pavilion Building

We have Chatham Health Department approval for our septic plan and bathroom facilities, and Zoning approval to place the building. No funding is available for either the septic or the bathrooms at this time. It seems that we need more detailed plans for the layout of the kitchen area before the building department will issue a permit. We'll be working on that next.

The Bob Chester Engine Building

We had planned to erect a second engine building about 40 feet west of the current building. My dad and his wife have been tremendous supporters financially over the years while we struggled with our co-tenant and the landlord over use of the property. In his memory, the family will provide funding for the building, primarily materials we cannot produce on site. This moves the project up the timetable and puts more pressure on our sawmill crew to produce the beams needed. The building will house small flywheel engines as well as dad's two put-put tractors and other items. A complete wrap around porch is planned for this building (so I don't have to add it later!). I am excited to get started!

STATIONARY ENGINE BUILDING

It's hard to believe with the cold weather and snow that we've just gotten, in two months we have our Spring show! We have plenty of new things for our spectators to enjoy, the most exciting being our new big building. We also have several new engines in the Engine Building for display. My 25HP Superior will be running, and we received a donation of 3 single cylinder diesel generators – 2 Wittes and a Nordberg. One Witte and the Nordberg are running, and might even be generating power by the time of the show. Allen has also gotten another of our small Kohler light plants running and generating electricity. I have also brought a 50HP Clark diesel to the farm for the engine building. It needs an air intake box – if anyone has leads on parts for a Clark type PC engine, let me know. The engine is currently on a large air compressor cart but needs two 8.25-20 tires and tubes to be rollable. If anyone has some they would like to donate, let me know.

Progress continues on the Ruston diesel. After lots of oil, acetylene, oxygen, and a custom-made puller, I have finally been able to remove all the components on the sideshaft, allowing removal of the sideshaft and governor/injection pump box. The injection pump rocker arm and plunger are badly stuck, so I will soak the entire assembly in waste diesel to try freeing it up. I also started cleaning the main bearings. Upon closer inspection, the PTO side bearing seems to have been run dry for quite some time and has badly damaged the Babbitt lining, so it will need to be repoured. The next step will be to remove the piston and rod to check the condition of the piston, rings, and bore.

I am continuing work on the Clark forklift as well. The brake rotors are designed to slide on a splined shaft, but they are seized on tight. I fabricated a puller to remove them, but more heat, oil, and time is required. Nate and Dave are working on the steering clutch for the HD5. The clutch has been removed and disassembled, and is waiting for new clutch disks for reassembly.

This is going to be another busy year! There will be jobs for everyone, no matter what interests or skills you have. Stop by the Farm on a weekend and see what's going on!
