A new oak skid is in process for the Clark, so once that job is complete the Clark and Bessemer can be moved as well. Plumbing for gas, air and water will come next and complete our display. With the huge increase in running engines, anyone interested in stationary engines should consider volunteering during the show!

We still have an open Committee Chair for the construction equipment committee. If anyone is interested in taking on this position, let me know.

Saw Mill

The sawmill was busy during the Spring show providing some additional material for our construction needs. As of now, we pretty much ran out of almost everything in stock. Time to regroup for the next set of projects. Really short on 1" siding. I have a list to give to the sawyer for future projects!

Needed! Pine logs 8'6" to 16'6' as always. Our supply of shorter material is rather thin.

Bob Chester Engine Building

We have been busy on the building over the last couple of months. The soffits are complete and the dividing half walls are being installed on the front overhang. The engines (all but 3) have been moved into the building. Cabinets, countertops and a sliding door have been installed in the work room in the rear. A donation from Natures Art via Marc B. provided the cabinets and countertops. Conner has the Clark skid nearly complete (not a small task!) so we'll have a move day for that engine and the Bessimer.















A painting project is beginning and will need help to mask off doors, windows, etc! Then it's on to the Clark exhaust piping, a pad for the propane tanks, and an entrance apron on the west side door (that was waiting on the Clark exhaust installation).

Other Projects

A wainscoted railing is being installed on the pavilion to replace the temporary ropes. Thinking a little further down the road, a vinyl curtain system will make the area more usable during poor weather, and transform it into a usable 3-season space. A little pricey, but I'm exploring options. Looking to do the new engine building the same way as well to protect the engines that are displayed there.

Engine building one has suffered from the lack of a 'work' room on the rear for tools and parts storage. This is what led to the new engine building getting such a space. So, now I'm in the process of enclosing part of the rear overhang for that purpose. See Art C. to help.

The second bleacher set for the pulling pit needs to be shortened to match the first one completed last fall. The trailer used by the pullers is being refurbished as well and will easily be complete for the July show. See Art C. for info.

The upper part of the farmhouse has been painted and at least part of the front garage will see some paint soon.

Our old repair shop up front is getting a much-needed sorting and cleaning with the intent to continue to make it a working machine shop. See Chris Allen to help.
