PRESIDENT'S NOTES -- George Lehr

We had a fairly mild winter with almost no snow and that helped in getting the work to dredge the pond completed. There is, however, much more to be done to grade the road and the field in readiness for the May show. Other winter activity included running wiring and installing outlets throughout the new Tractor Building and adding insulation in the new Repair Building (old Tractor Shed).

We also got several donations. Most notably, from East Hartford Parts and Equipment; a Northwest 80D crane, two large hydraulic presses, two large steel revolving hardware storage bins (with hardware), several pallets of old equipment manuals and huge rolls of material that's similar in appearance to shop towel material. The 80D had not moved in about 20 years and considerable effort was required to affect its retrieval. Here's a link to the video Connor posted on YouTube with the highlights:

We also received a powered ride-on floor sweeper and a large sheet metal shear from Robert E. Lee. The sweeper should be great for keeping the floor clean in the new Tractor Building.

Both the Colchester town hall and Senior Center are not available to us for our March 31st meeting, so the March meeting will be held in the new Tractor Building at the farm. That's only four days before the Mudslinger picnic on Saturday, April 4th. Hope to see everyone there.

FROM THE DESK OF THE TREASURER – Art Chester

There are a couple of spots in the new Tractor Barn available. A \$2500 donation will reserve an 8' by 22' space in the building. The building committee reviews and approves all spaces to ensure we have good quality, appropriate displays. Act now, as they will be gone soon!

Dues for 2020 are due and payable, and still \$20.00 per year.

Lifetime memberships are \$500 and help the museum grow!

I will be sending out reminders to all who have spaces in the building for the yearly maintenance portion of their spaces. The building committee settled on \$75 for the first space, and \$50 each for additional spaces. The funds are to help offset costs for electricity, insurance, and a soon to come IP camera system.

Saw Mill

Our emphasis remains on producing the necessary materials for the second engine building. We can now store lumber under the rear shed roof of the new tractor building, giving us more room under the mill.

Logs for the saw mill. In particular, 16'6" pine logs that are 20-inch diameter or more on the small end for rafters (10 logs needed), and four 24'6" logs of similar size if at all possible. Call Art at 860-982-5158 to haul.

Pavilion Building

The foundation is in place, as well as the pass-thru's for utilities and most of the backfilling. Using the IH 210, we moved 12 large loads to the site on a nice Sunday in February. The D4 helped out grading and even had to tow a stuck Komatsu! I have pictures! When we get the water line installed and complete the backfilling operation, the floor can be poured.

Pond Excavation

The pond project is complete, except for an overflow drain system if needed. Over 2840 yards of material were removed. There is still substantial clean-up of the site needed, but it looks great! The relatively mild weather allowed us to dig in January!

Tractor Building

We are moving things into the building to be set up on the mezzanine in the spring and thinking about how to display other items. We have also set up a consignment area at the west door where we can sell unneeded items and take in items from members to sell.

It works like this: Bring the item to the area, fill out a numbered tag and enter your info in the blue binder, along with minimum sale price. You need not be there to sell an item. 10% of the sale price goes to the Farm. See Art for more info

Needed!

Trenching and piping help to install power, communications and water to the Pavilion. Trenching and piping from the overflow basin for the pond to daylight. We need to locate (and repair!) the roof drains for the front of the engine building damaged during the pond excavation. There's plenty more – see Art.

ENGINES -- Connor Bishop

While the winter has been slow like usual, we have had some activity at the Farm due to the mild winter. The most exciting news is that the Northwest 80D crane, donated by East Hartford Equipment, has been transported to the Farm! Many thanks to Bob Pabst for hauling it for us. With the machine now at the farm, we can work on fixing the fuel pump, dialing in the two new injectors, and re-attaching the boom.

We also have made headway in getting some of our dump trucks running. The Euclid has steering again, the R210 has a new carburetor, and the Terex has some of the gears in its transmission functioning. However, our Northwest 80D shovel that we were using to load the trucks is now struggling to maintain engine oil pressure. If new, tighter oil pump drive belts do not fix the problem, we will need to pull the motor and rebuild it.

We have another busy year ahead of us! The farmhouse needs painting, the food pavilion will be going up, we'll be hauling endless loads of material for our field leveling project, and plenty of other things as they come up. If there's any job at the farm that interests you, whether it's earthmoving, building construction, the sawmill, running engines or tractors, or anything else, stop by on the weekend and see what needs to be done!


